



Angi gets on her bike to aid charity

A PASSIONATE biker and mum-of-two will take part in a London-to-Edinburgh ride to raise money for a breast cancer charity.

For Angi Roslyn, it's the perfect way to put something back after she recovered from the disease herself earlier this year.

The ride will benefit the Lavender Trust, which offers a support service and information aimed at the 20 percent of breast cancer patients who are under 50.

Setting off from the famous bikers' spot, the Ace Cafe, in London on August 20, the ride will be part of an international campaign, Changing Gears, and there will be similar events in America and Australia later in the year.

The 20 riders will arrive in Edinburgh eight days later.

Angi said: "What a brilliant way to put something back.

"I've been passionate about bikes since I was 18, and I have owned one ever since.

"The issues the trust tackles are isolation, fear and the worry of not being around for kids.

"I know from experience that your confidence takes a big blow."

Angi, from Cubley Rise in Cubley, will be the only rider from Yorkshire in an international field.

She needs to raise at least £2,500 in sponsorship - and is urging people to support her.

Anyone interested in supporting her can drop into the Rose and Crown pub on Shrewsbury Road in Penistone, where landlady Marianne Ryalls is supporting her efforts.

Marianne said: "We're all really proud of her."
