Cancer survivors take the rides of their lives

IF you are around Willoughby tomorrow morning and happen to come across a group of leather-clad bikies, relax.

They are not your typical bikie gang.

Instead they are 15 breast cancer survivors who were lent brand new Harley-Davidson motorbikes to take to Brisbane.

The women are from a group called Amazon Heart, made up of breast cancer survivors from around the world who raise awareness of the disease and encourage each other to live life to the fullest.

Elanora Heights mum Donna Handley will be among them when they set off from the set of Channel 9's *Today* show tomorrow.

"Every mile we ride will be a celebration of our journey through breast cancer, as well as a powerful inspiration of the thousands of other women diagnosed with the disease in Australia each year," the 40-year-old said.

The ride will also be used to raise funds for the breast cancer survivor's Dragons Abreast charity rowing gala which will be held in Brisbane and in which local group Pittwater Pinks will take part.

Riders are expected to reach Brisbane on October 20.
