She will be joined by Peri Liddel, a dermatology nurse from Frenchs Forest.

While Mrs Handley, of Elanora Heights, will ride a new bike provided by Harley Davidson, Ms Liddel will drive the support van.

"I don't have a bike licence," Ms Liddel said.

"Maybe I'll learn on the trip - at least I should get a chance to ride pillion."

Mrs Handley said: "I've learnt to never say no, to give everything a go, to live each day to the fullest.

"When you've had breast cancer, you never know if it will come back so you take on adventures and challenges, it puts an urgency on things.

"I learned to ride after being diagnosed. I needed something in my life, to set a goal to keep me going - it's my challenge, my thrill."

The two women will be at Centro Warriewood on Saturday, September 8, to raise funds by selling raffle tickets and pink and white
