

Triumph in breast cancer battle

MEREDITH Campbell is a pin-up girl.

The Nundah breast cancer survivor features in an exhibition by Brisbane photographer David Marsh that tells the story of 12 women and their determination to live life to the full.

Organised by the Queensland Cancer Fund, it is called *Moving Forward: A Day in the Lives of 12 women with Breast Cancer* and portrays the women in activities that kept them positive and strong during and after their cancer treatment.

Ms Campbell, who was 33 when diagnosed, was photographed on her Triumph Bonneville American touring bike.

She said she always wanted to take up motorbike riding and decided to get her licence after treatment.

"I guess it's something I'd always wanted to do," she said.

"It gives me a sense of freedom and of getting out on the road and leaving work and all those things behind me."

Queensland Governor Quentin Bryce opened the exhibition yesterday at Waterfront Place, Eagle St, in the city.

The images will remain on display through until November 11.
